

What: You can train and work in Aboriginal health in Victoria!

Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services (ACCHSs) offer a unique comprehensive primary health care setting experience where you work as part of a supportive, multi-disciplinary clinical team.

Where: ACCHSs that are accredited Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health training posts are located in urban and regional centres throughout Victoria (see map overleaf).

Why: Training or working in an ACCHS gives you the opportunity to gain exposure to a wide range of complex clinical presentations including managing chronic disease, implementing preventative health care, and addressing public health concerns with Aboriginal people.

Experience the Aboriginal holistic model of health, become a culturally safe practitioner and enjoy the flexibility of a family-friendly workplace with 9-5 hours!
